

# HOLY WEEK 2024 at CHRIST THE KING - OLIVER & ST. ANNE - OSOYOOS

# PALM SUNDAY (23/24 March, 2024 Regular Saturday & Sunday schedule)

This great solemnity celebrates Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem for the Jewish festival of Passover. Great crowds of people lined the streets waving branches to welcome Jesus, shouting 'Hosanna!' Palm branches are blessed and distributed. This day is also known as Passion Sunday because the Church anticipates Good Friday by reading the Passion according to St. Luke.

# **HOLY THURSDAY** (28 March, 2024 7 PM at St. Anne - Osoyoos)

Holy Thursday is the day on which we commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus (our Eucharist). He washed feet and served. [Because of the geography of our diocese and for travel considerations the Chrism Mass is celebrated at the Cathedral in Nelson on Monday, 25 March. The oils blessed at this Mass are used for the sacraments throughout the coming year.]

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated in the evening. After Mass the Blessed Sacrament is taken in procession to an "Altar of Repose" and the main altar is stripped bare. Even the Holy Water is removed from the fonts until the Easter Vigil when we renew our Baptismal promises. Since Holy Thursday is the day which commemorates the first Holy Eucharist, adoration of the Real Presence of our Lord by all the faithful at the "Altar of Repose" is strongly encouraged until 9 PM. At Christ the King Church Eucharistic Adoration will be from 9 PM to Midnight.

# GOOD FRIDAY (29 March, 2024 12 Noon at St. Anne & 3 PM at Christ the King - Oliver)

Good Friday is the day of the Crucifixion. It is a day on which Christians fast and pray, calling to mind the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. In this way we participate in his suffering in order that we may also participate in his Resurrection. The liturgy is comprised of three parts: The Liturgy of the Word; Veneration of the Cross & Holy Land Support; Holy Communion.

During the Liturgy of the Word St. John's account of The Passion is read. The Passion is followed by "Universal Prayers" (or "Prayers of the Faithful") during which the congregation prays for a series of different needs of the Church and all humanity. The second part of the Good Friday service is the Veneration of the Cross. The cross is solemnly unveiled, followed by the silent veneration (the cross will remain in place at the end of the liturgy for personal veneration). Then, a special collection is taken to support the Christian minorities in Israel and the Palestinian Territory. Sacred sites and institutions (schools, hospitals, etc.) cannot be managed by the very few Christians living in the region. The third part of the service is the distribution of Holy Communion. "We adore you O Christ and we praise You, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world." (St. Alphonsus Liguori). The Divine Mercy Novena begins today, continuing to 07 April, Divine Mercy Sunday.

# HOLY SATURDAY (30 March, 2024 7:30 PM at Christ the King - Oliver)

\*Note the later time of the Saturday Mass; this day only. No Saturday evening Mass at St. Anne\*

Holy Saturday, during the day, our churches are bare and desolate. No Mass may be offered during the day. The Blessing of Easter foods will be in the church at 12 Noon. While more customary among Poles, Italians and Ukrainians, all people are welcome to attend the blessing rite.

The Easter Vigil: After a day of desolation, the faithful, keeping vigil during Holy Saturday night, participate with Christ in the joy of His Resurrection, anticipating Christ's final coming.

The Vigil has four main parts:

The Celebration of New Light reminds us that Christ is our Light. A fire is blessed, and from this new fire, the Paschal Candle is lit, and subsequently all candles in the dark church. The silence of the night is broken by the sound of the "Exultet."

The Liturgy of the Word recalls the main events of our salvation from Creation to Christ's resurrection.

The Liturgy of Baptism (when there are candidates to be baptized) reminds us that we were baptized into Christ and so participate in his saving work. First water, the sign of cleansing and new life, is blessed; then we renounce our sins and renew our profession of faith.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist: We offer the perfect sacrifice and receive our Saviour in Holy Communion. The Mass ends as the People of God go forth to proclaim and live the Good News of the Resurrection.

EASTER SUNDAY (31 March, 2024 8:15 AM and 11 AM at St. Anne 9:30 AM at Christ the King) In the Octave of Easter, each day's Gospel selection narrates one of the post-Resurrection appearances of Jesus, while the first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke's account of the life and growth of the early Church. The Easter season continues for 50 days, until Pentecost.
