EASTER at CHRIST THE KING - OLIVER & ST. ANNE - OSOYOOS HOLY SATURDAY

(19 April, 2025 7:30 PM at Christ the King - Oliver) Note the later time of the Saturday Mass; this day only. No Saturday evening Mass at St. Anne*

Holy Saturday, during the day, our churches are bare and desolate. No Mass may be offered during the day. The Blessing of Easter foods will be in St. Anne Church at 12 Noon. While more customary among Poles, Italians and Ukrainians, all people are welcome to attend the blessing.

The Easter Vigil: After a day of desolation, the faithful, keeping vigil during Holy Saturday night, participate with Christ in the joy of His Resurrection, anticipating Christ's final coming.

The Vigil has four main parts:

The Celebration of New Light reminds us that Christ is our Light. A fire is

blessed, and from this new fire, the Paschal Candle is lit, and subsequently all candles in the dark church. The silence of the night is broken by the sound of the "Exultet."

The Liturgy of the Word recalls the main events of our salvation from Creation to Christ's resurrection.

The Liturgy of Baptism (when there are candidates to be baptized) reminds us that we were baptized into Christ and so participate in his saving work. First water, the sign of cleansing and new life, is blessed; then we renounce our sins and renew our profession of faith.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist: We offer the perfect sacrifice and receive our Saviour in Holy Communion. The Mass ends as the People of God go forth to proclaim and live the Good News of the Resurrection.

EASTER SUNDAY (20 April, 2025 8:15 AM and 11 AM at St. Anne 9:30 AM at Christ the King)

In the Octave of Easter, each day's Gospel selection narrates one of the post-Resurrection appearances of Jesus, while the first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke's account of the life and growth of the **early Church. The Easter** season continues for 50 days, until Pentecost.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings and peace in the Lord!

Mary Magdalene went and said to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord." (John 20.18)

We see in our Gospel for Easter Sunday that Mary's expectations were shattered when she went to Jesus' tomb. So much so, she had to run and tell Peter and John, who in turn run to the empty tomb themselves and share in her astonishment. But it wasn't astonishment at the resurrection of Jesus. Rather, it was astonishment that the tomb was empty.

Mary's astonishment and sadness soon gave way to Easter joy when Jesus appeared to her and revealed that He had indeed risen from the dead.
